Sept-Îles, July 3, 2025 – The Centre de services scolaire du Littoral is proud to announce that two students from École St-Joseph, Anaïs Bilodeau and Joon Fabroni, have been selected as finalists in the Parcours *Photo-Graphie*, an initiative led by the Équipe culture-éducation as part of L'Odyssée Culturelle.

The Quebec-wide project, which brought together some thirty schools across the province, aims to marry artistic expression and visual storytelling through photography. École St-Joseph was honoured to have been the sole North Shore representative in this enriching cultural adventure.

This initiative was carried out primarily through fine arts (technology) classes, in collaboration with a French and outdoor education class. This interdisciplinary approach allowed students to develop an artistic vision rooted in their natural and cultural environment.

Anaïs and Joon's finalist project, which focuses on the historic lighthouse at Ellis Bay, is now featured in the Équipe culture-éducation virtual gallery, accessible to the public via this <u>link</u>.
